The gray wolf or grey wolf (*Canis lupus*), also known as the timber wolf or western wolf, is a canine native to the wilderness and remote areas of **Eurasia** and **North America**. It is the largest extant member of its family, with males averaging and females . Like the red wolf, it is distinguished from other *Canis* species by its larger size and less pointed features, particularly on the ears and muzzle. Its winter fur is long and bushy and predominantly a mottled gray in color, although nearly pure white, red, and brown to black also occur. . 37 subspecies of *C. lupus* are recognized by *MDW*.
